


Marco Clark, Ed.D. named President of Holy Cross College at Notre Dame, Indiana



NOTRE DAME, IN (April 13, 2022) — Holy Cross College at Notre Dame, Indiana, has named Marco Clark, Ed.D., as president of the College, effective July 1, 2022. Dr. Clark will be the first president of the College who is not a Holy Cross brother or priest. Dr. Clark comes to Holy Cross College from St. Edward's University, sponsored by the Brothers of Holy Cross, Moreau Province, located in Austin, Texas, and has worked for over thirty years as a Catholic educator and leader in higher education and secondary schools sponsored by the Congregation of Holy Cross. He will succeed Rev. David T. Tyson, C.S.C., who is retiring and who became president on July 31, 2017.

Who's right?

It may be easy to take a position on an issue, especially if our mind and our feelings have been on the same path before. But we have probably seen in many court trials that we have watched on TV, in which witnesses have drawn conclusions from what they "have seen" even if they were not wearing glasses for seeing in a distance at the time. Maybe there were aspects of the scene that were not visible to these witnesses. On cross examination these witnesses had to admit that what they saw was from their point of view.

Is this a time for us to admit that we do not have God's eyes and cannot have access to the whole picture in all of its complexity? We make judgements based on previous knowledge and from our personal experience. When we begin our conversations with the words, "from my perspective" we open ourselves up to a dialog which might prove to be a learning experience for those who are participating. Between a perfect "right or wrong" stance there might be middle ground which acknowledges the complexities of the situation. This is the kind of dialog that can happen in Pope Francis' call for the church to experience synodality, which begins with a willingness to listen as well as share points of view. Could this also be a way of showing love of neighbor?

- Do you often think you have the only correct answer in a discussion?
- Is it hard to listen to people who do not agree with you?
- If you began a discussion with the words, "from my point of view," would it help in discussing an issue?

O God, help me to be open to the Spirit being revealed through others.


