Christmas Eve, cocktail hour, dinner after entertainment under candlelight.


Native dress, chorus, African songs engulf us, hearts soaring for














Columba Hall Dinner

Holy Family

It is at this time of the year – Christmas, that our thoughts tend to drift toward thinking about the Holy Family, that is, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

Influenced by the Nativity accounts in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke (Chapters 1 and 2 respectively), my thoughts ruminate on the family's socioeconomic status.

Although certain inferences may be drawn from Matthew's and Luke's narratives and from numerous anonymous apocryphal stories emanating down through the centuries that may suggest otherwise, the Holy Family would not have been "dirt" poor.

As the legal head of the family, it was St. Joseph's position that was the determinate: As a carpenter in his day he merited the title of **artisan** – one skilled in the fashioning of wood, metal, and stone, elevating the individual above the commoner or peasant class, deserving of more than adequate financial compensation.

Furthermore, considered authentic, is Matthew's declaration that



St. Joseph was **royalty** by birth, "of the family and house of [King] David" (Matt. 2:4).

Notwithstanding St. Joseph's crown heritage and more than likely lower-middle class socioeconomic status, we can be more than confident that both virtuous he and his wife and foster son lived a modest style life, contented, as the majority of their neighbors, with the resources God provided.


