

Dan Lawton, Author The Case of Kevin Barry

On Friday, November 17, Dan Lawton, a lawyer from San Diego and author of the best-selling book *Above the Ground*, spoke to members of the Columba Hall Community and guests from Holy Cross Village. Dan became interested in 2000 in the case of Kevin Barry, a young man who had been in a jail in Northern Ireland. He had been accused of committing a murder during "The Troubles" in the country back in 1978. Kevin escaped the prison and made his way to America where he eventually had to fight extradition by the United Kingdom. Dan took up Kevin's case and helped convince the British that Kevin could not be extradited.

Dan came to Notre Dame to sign copies of his book in the Notre Dame Bookstore on the day before the Notre Dame football game with Wake Forest. His wife Kelly came along with him and helped with his presentation both at Columba Hall and subsequently at the Notre Dame Law School. Dan had been an undergraduate student at Notre Dame from 1978 to 1981. Then he went to the Georgetown Law School before moving back to practice law in San Diego.



Sermon



Throughout Jesus' ministry large crowds flocked to hear Him preach. There were times, however, when Jesus apparently had intended to speak only to those whom he regarded as his chosen disciples. While the Gospels otherwise appear never to cite an instance in witch Jesus excluded anyone else from listening to Him, there evidently was at least one occasion that Jesus planned teaching only His disciples.

That occasion, perhaps surprising to many, was, as St. Luke in Chapter 6 of his Gospel seems to indicate, the **Sermon on the Plain (identified as the Sermon on the Mount in Chapter 5 of St. Matthew's Gospel).** Therein St. Luke states: "And raising his eyes toward his [Jesus'] disciples he said: 'Blessed,,,'" (v, 20) an evident indication toward whom Jesus addressed His words.

Everyone present, of course, heard what Jesus said to his disciples. And in view of future prospects, the application applied to all who were listening. For Jesus instruction in the matter of discipleship and righteousness was imperative for those who had already committed themselves to follow Him.

To all Christians, but particularly consecrated religious, Jesus delivered His "Sermon" especially.




