

— Do We Have Another Saint? — Brother Columba O'Neill, C.S.C. (1848-1923)



Intercession for Miss Velma Gorman, Atlanta, Georgia

Three letters were written between Feb 18 and May 2, 1921, to Brother Columba describing her cure from arm paralysis as a result of a Spanish Influenza inoculation that hit a nerve. I quote from only her first letter.

First letter: February 18,1921

- "Dear Brother Columba, / Let me try to express my gratitude to you for the wonderful miracle, you have performed on me, through the 'Sacred Heart of Jesus."
- "Over two and a half years ago [mid-1918]" the telephone company for which she worked compelled all of its employees to be inoculated.
- After her inoculation, she "suffered great pain all of the time. ...the pain never ceased for a moment."
- For days the pain worsened, so she went to the family doctor who diagnosed that the nerve in her arm had been punctured.
- "A few weeks later, my arm & hand got paralyzed, and I was confined to bed for several months."
- "After taking electrical treatments for three months, which proved useless, the Drs. ordered an operation & said, 'My arm & hand would never be of any use to me again.' Five specialists came to see me & would not handle my case at all."

- She learned from a Mrs. Lundrum "who has a brother a priest [research reveals that there was no CSC priest at Notre Dame by that name] at Notre Dame" that she will write to at once.
- "When I got your Sacred Heart badge, I pinned it over my bandages and glass shield that I had to wear. I at once started a nine-day novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Each night before retiring, I said the Litany of the Sacred Heart and prayed all the time for my cure. On the evening before the ninth day my arm grew much worse. I nearly went insane the pain was so great. I could not sleep, so I prayed to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and fell asleep about 4:00 am. When I arose at 7:00 am the pain had ceased. This was the first time in two and a half years the pain had stoped [sic]. When the bandages & glass shield were removed that morning, the running sore had stoped [sic], there was not even a scab on it, only a scar. I can't express my joy."
- "My Drs. & folks and everyone who seen my arm, were astonished. The Drs. said, 'They couldn't understand it. It was a miracle."




Gilmour's 75th


