#### A Birthday Revisited


I recollect that sixteen years ago I marked my birthday while on a retreat in rural autumn splendor just below Gethsemani, Kentucky, Trappist seat



In response to the incident occurring on Mount Sinai involving the Jews' idolatrous apostasy of worshipping the Golden Calf, God declared, "Let me alone, then, that my anger may turn against them." 
When it came to speaking to God, Moses seemed quite deft. Perhaps he had somehow overcome the speech impediment about which he complained at the time of the burning bush.


