The camaraderie suspends, narrows into pairs by color, an aggregate of two. It works for reproduction since a privacy demands it, unlike bees.


Incapable of more, the soul seeks one who listens, understands, invites inside where music's made and wonder entertains.

Healthy Aging Series

During the Fall Series on Healthy Aging, it was recommended that individuals, as they age, follow the interdependent model which appears to be the best model for optimum health.

This model entails doing everything individuals can do for themselves but also remain open to assistance from others. By this term, openness to assistance, it is meant that an individual be open and share all their symptoms (physical, mental and emotional) with their primary physician during their yearly or bi-yearly visits. "Speak <u>up – Don't Hide"</u> is a good rule of thumb. Truthfulness will help the physician or medical professional get a complete, comprehensive picture and implement a treatment modality that can restore, correct your health issue, or even save your life.

On many occasions, in my years with older adults, I would hear the denial responses such as, "it's no big deal" or "it will go away in a few days" or "I fear what the doctor will tell me." The most common response is: "I only go to the doctor when I have a bodily crisis."

Regular doctor visits, early detection, and preventive care are healthy choices to pursue as we age in place. In conclusion, a significant aspect of the interdependent approach to your health is: "Work with the doctor (medical professionals) and Not against them." It can save your life and keep you healthy.

PERSONAL STORY: After my fall in 2019 due to dehydration, I thought I was fine until our province nurse noticed some abnormalities in my gait and walking. Immediately, she strongly recommended that I get to the ER. 24 hours later I was in surgery with a brain bleed. The surgery saved my life. As a result, this was a situation where I needed to listen to medical advice (and get assistance from others) and "Not Play Doctor."
