


Biblical Commentary


In addition to the Topical Bible previously described here in *Bible Bites*,

there is another very useful aid that can be used in the scholarly study of the Bible, the commentary.


Very much like most reference books, the biblical commentary is a specifically organized listing of citations along with their corresponding books, chapters, and verses; interpretations, explanations, applications, and other related extraneous information, as well as supplemental editorial material. The average size of the standard biblical commnentary is 2200 pages.



The premier edition of biblical commentaries is the *St. Jerome Biblical Commentary For the Twenty-First Century* (3rd Revised.).



A Hope That Leads to Joy




