Reflection for the Liturgy of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary by Brother Robert Mosher. C.S.C.

Because of her unquestionable essential participation in the Divine plan for the redemption of humankind, Mary's assumption into heaven, body and soul. Is the

most salutary merit consequent of the achievement of that redemption - resurrection of her own Son Jesus.

The Bishop David Class of '84 held its reunion in early June. Brother Dennis, their class moderator, was invited to attend the reunion activities.



Now known as Holy Cross High School, the co-ed school now uses the B.D. facilities. Holy Cross graciously invited the Bishop David and Angela Merici alumni to the school.



The front of the high school looks pretty much the same except for the new windows. The classrooms are now air-conditioned.



The Brothers' former residence (now the Bishop David Apartments) are vacant. They served as a residence for retired priests of the Archdiocese. The school is discussing with the Archdiocese how to best use that building.



The Brothers' Chapel has retained its look from its days as the Brothers' chapel. HCHS uses the Chapel for small groups.



Directly behind the school cafeteria are the new stands used for home football games. The field is grass and has lights. The stadium entrance honors the legacy of Angela Merici and Bishop David





