Remembering Br. Joseph Chvala, CSC

(This from my book, *Life Experiences and Random Thoughts...*)



My most memorable and influential high school teacher was Brother Joseph. It was sophomore year, 1953, first day of English class. As this naive fifteen year old observed the young-looking, slight, thin brother wearing a black cassock and Roman collar (today the brothers wear civilian clothes), my immediate thought was, "This is gonna be easy." Within five minutes during his introductory remarks outlining expectations of his students, I said to myself, "This is gonna be tough," and tough it was and challenging.

The drudgery of long spelling and vocabulary lists, frequent reading and writing assignments were endured. Naive sophomores do not appreciate an excellent teacher until after the challenge has been met and the recognition of what was accomplished is realized. I learned to accept Br. Joe's criticism on my assignments but always experienced a sense of satisfaction when my essay was read to the class by him highlighting a choice of a word, the construction of a sentence or paragraph as an example of good writing.

Despite those long lines of complainers on parent-teacher conference nights outside his classroom door, I know other students came to appreciate his prodding, challenges, encouragement and demands of excellence and realized what was accomplished after completing his class. Today's students need more Br. Josephs touching their lives.



To this day, I consider Br. Joseph the world's best HS English teacher. The world could use many more like him.





Driver Awareness Training

RE: Driver Awareness Training

Last summer I shared an updated policy regarding our efforts to manage risks related to driving. The guidelines presented best practices related to safe and responsible driving and related to care of vehicles. One of those best practices is taking classes to remind us of what we can do to be better, safer drivers. As stated in the policy, driver awareness training programs have been proven to improve safety, decrease accidents, and lower insurance rates for participants. Participation in such programs

that offer training credits is expected of all our drivers every two years.

In support of this effort to be better, safer drivers, the province will be providing two options for completing driver awareness training. First, we have scheduled a live program for April 19, 2018, in the Brother William Geenen Room at Andre Place. That program will begin at 9:00 am and will take about 90 minutes, more if there are questions. Please contact Sharan Palmer in our Business Office at spalmer@brothersofholycross.com or by phone at 574-631-2920 if you plan to attend the session on April 19. The second option is to participate in online driver awareness training.

Both of these options are being provided by our insurance provider, Christian Brothers Risk Pooling Trust. For the live program, all you need do is participate fully in the entire class. For the online option, please contact Sharan at spalmer@brothersofholycross.com to get additional information. The online program requires you to watch a video and then answer a series of questions to prove to have learned the ideas presented. With the online options you may select your own time(s) for either a series of short presentations or one full training session that lasts about 77 minutes, plus time for a quiz. Of course you are free to identify other options for driver awareness training classes through adult education providers like AARP. Just send in the certificate.

Participating in sessions like these is a requirement of our insurance company because the research clearly indicates they make a difference in improving driver safety. They also give us a small discount for each participant.

I would appreciate your initiative in identifying driver awareness training options that fit your schedule and learning preferences. As we proceed through 2018, I will be following up to make sure all our drivers have successfully completed a program over the last two years. Your initiative will avoid problems with our insurance provider.


