Cathedral Celebrates School's 98th Birthday with Day of Service!

On September 15, 2016, all Cathedral students, faculty, and staff spent the day volunteering at 44 locations in greater Indianapolis. Beginning the day at 8 AM, the Cathedral High School family fanned out across Indianapolis and surrounding counties to help a wide variety of central Indiana not-for-profits. The entire school, 1,185 students plus 120+ faculty and staff, pitched in on everything from making superhero capes to helping build a Habitat home the seniors are helping sponsor this year. "The Day of Service is a meaningful way for students and staff to celebrate Cathedral High School's 98th birthday and give back to the community."

This is the fourth year that Cathedral High School has participated in a school-wide birthday celebration through service to the community. The school, founded in 1918, has a long tradition of philanthropy. "Our annual Day of Service helps our students learn about the importance of giving back," Principal Dave Worland says. "This has been an integral part of Cathedral's identity and part of our Holy Cross tradition. This is one of the unique ways we achieve our mission of transforming a diverse group of students and helping them understand how they can contribute to a better community here in Indianapolis."

President Brother John Paige CSC Remarks 50th Anniversary/Brother Andre Statue Dedication: September 19, 2016

A joyous welcome to all of you today, the anniversary fifty years to the day of the first classes held at Holy Cross.

Fifty years ago the scene was a bit more fundamental...I know because I was here myself that day as a student-brother, a junior physics major at the University of Notre Dame. Let me paint the picture as I remember:

THEN

- ---Holy Cross Junior College began classes that day with 49 Holy Cross student-brothers and brother-candidates enrolled in college classes. Brother James Leik CSC, was a faculty member in the Business Department; Father Tom McNally CSC, was chaplain. The original college building consisted of four classrooms, a library, and an auditorium (Driscoll Hall). The St. Joseph Chapel was still under construction, James and Basil Halls (student-brother/candidate residences) were also incomplete and partially occupied. By the end of that first academic year, a free-standing faculty residence building for brother-professors and staff (Andre Hall, now Anselm Hall), the maintenance garage, and a small gym (where Andre Place now stands) were completed.
- --Dujarie House infirmary, a medical facility for Brothers, was a small building with one wing being added at the far end of what is now the Holy Cross Village complex;
- -- the Provincial Administration building housed only the offices and residence of the Midwest Province Brothers administration;
- --St. Joseph High School, where our current provincial superior, Br. Chester Freel CSC, was a high school senior at the time, stood at the south end of the campus.

TODAY

- --Holy Cross College is now a four-year higher education institution with 647 traditional and non-traditional men and women students currently enrolled in our programs, with 355 men and women students living in college-sponsored residence housing;
- --Holy Cross Village is a now a major continuing care retirement community serving men and women in independent living situations (Andre Place, Riverside

Apartments, Senior Villas), an assisted living facility (Schubert Villa) and skilled-care nursing and memory unit areas (Dujarie House and the Quinn Memory Unit);

--The Provincial Administration Building now houses offices of the priests and Brothers of the Congregation of Holy Cross, namely the Midwest Province administration and the United States Province administration;

--St. Joseph High School is now located at a new site in downtown South Bend. Much of the original high school building at the south end of our campus is now demolished, but the former convent building, now the Holy Cross College St. Joseph Art & Science Center, is open for business.

Today I am reminded of the scripture passage: "Neither the planter nor the waterer matters; only God who makes things grow. It is all one who does the planting and who does the watering, and each will duly be paid according to their share in the work. We are fellow workers with God; you are God's work, God's building." (1 Cor. 3: 7-9).

Many people have been involved in these growing ministries over fifty years. But a constant source of spiritual inspiration, courage, and perseverance has been the patron of the Brothers of Holy Cross, who is so prominently honored on this campus: St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. And among the most dedicated apostles of St. Joseph is our own Holy Cross Brother, St. Andre Bessette.

Today we honor St. Joseph and his most welcoming apostle, St. Brother Andre, as we give thanks for our first fifty years. Brother Andre will now "personally" welcome all who enter this campus to visit the Congregation of Holy Cross, Holy Cross Village, and Holy Cross College. His statue will be a welcoming reminder that no matter how limited our talents or gifts may be, God uses all of us to "make things grow."

I speak especially to all our students here today: fifty years from now, where will you be? Who knows? But perhaps, like myself, and Brother Chester, and Brother James Leik, you may be here in this very spot...hopefully with fond memories and awesome wonder at what God will continue to accomplish in this place in the next fifty years.

The founder of the Congregation of Holy Cross, Blessed Basile Moreau, was convinced of the presence of God's Divine Providence in all things. As we look and live to the future, let us do so with his faith and conviction that "Holy Cross is not a human work, but God's very own."


