Brothers Pronounce Final Vows

Monday, August 16, forty-two Brothers of Holy Cross from fourteen states and Ireland assisted at a Solemn Mass when they pronounced their final vows in the Sacred Heart Church on the Notre Dame campus.

Rev. Theodore Mehling, Provincial of Holy Cross Fathers, celebrated the Mass and presided at the professions. He was assisted by Rev. Bernard McAvoys, pastor, Rev. Paul Rankin, subdeacon, and Rev. Lawrence LeVasseur, master of ceremonies.

Immediately after the Mass, the Brothers in groups of four pronounced their vows of Poverty, Chastity, and Obedience. Eleven added the fourth or fifth vow, "that of going to whatever the Superior General may wish to send me."

As part of the ceremony each Brother received as emblems of his profession a wooden cross, the symbol of Christ's Passion, and a blessed medal of St. Joseph, the special patron for the Brothers of Holy Cross.

Afternoon a luncheon for the newly professed and their guests was served at the Marie Hall, the Scholasticate of the Brothers attending the University of Notre Dame.

In Brief

During the past year Brothers Holy Cross in the United States Province earned forty-nine degrees: three Doctors, eleven Masters and thirty-five Bachelors for work done at eleven universities and colleges. Seventy-three Brothers were doing graduate work during the past summer session while 100 were working for their Bachelors. During the present scholastic year seventy Brothers are working for advanced degrees and ninety-eight for their Bachelors.

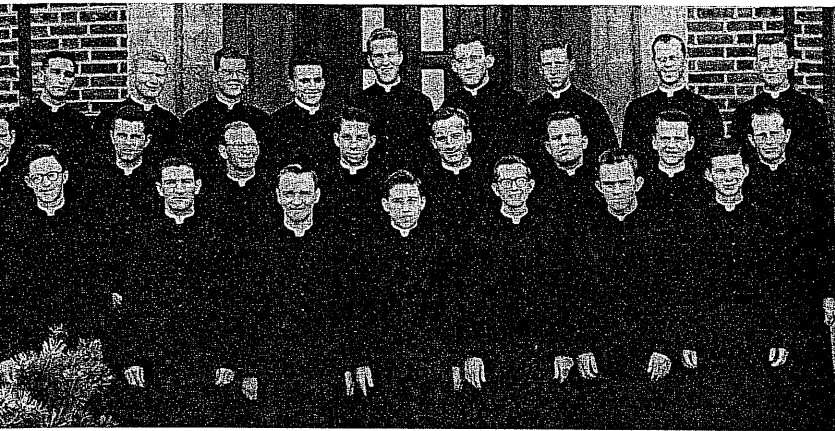

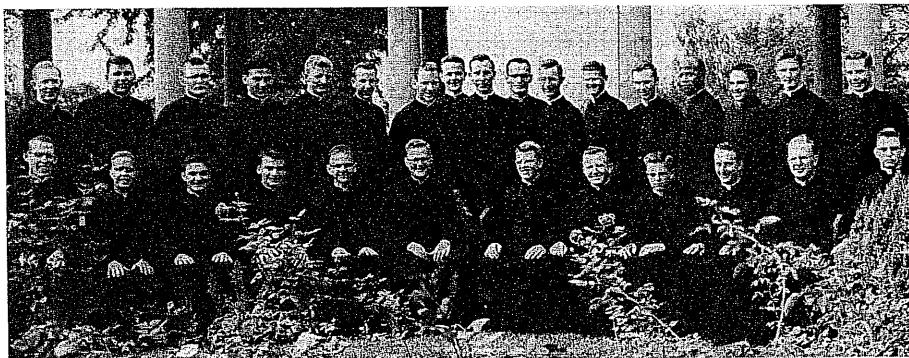
