## S.C. High School Teachers In Chicago Area Join For Talks

An educational conference for Holy Cross Priests and Brothers teaching at schools in the Chicago area was held on October 18th at Notre Dame High School in Niles, Illinois.

This was the first such joint meeting of Holy Cross Priests and Brothers working in secondary schools ever to be held. Initiator and host of the conference was Rev. Joseph E. O'Neill, C.S.C., principal of the Niles school. Coordinator of the program was Rev. Thomas

Markos, C.S.C., director of studies at Notre Dame High.

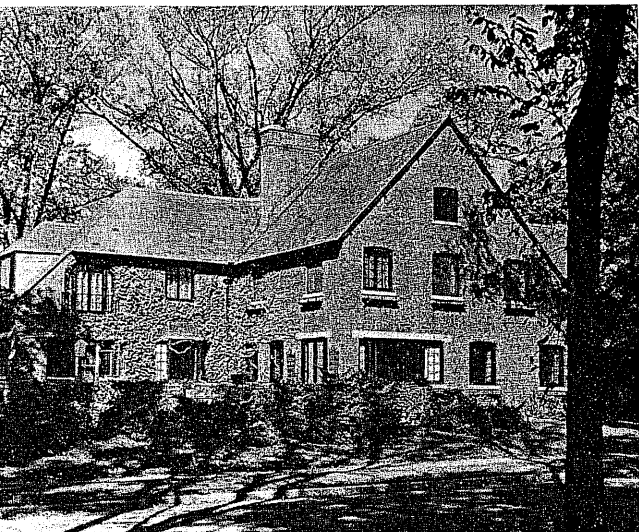
Featured item in the program was an address by Rev. Eugene C. Kennedy, M.M., professor of psychology and lecturer at Loyola University. His topic was "The Classroom Teacher's Role in the Guidance Program: Its extent and its limits."

Attending the institute were all the Holy Cross teachers from the host school, from Holy Trinity High in Chi-

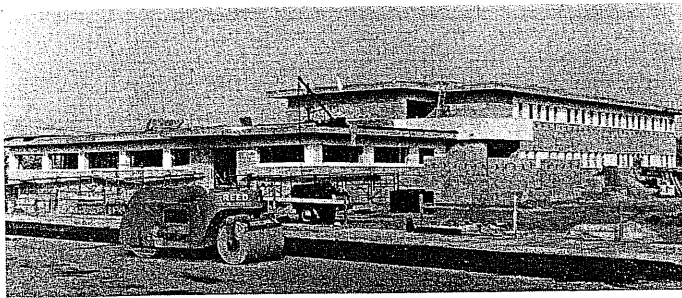
cago, Holy Cross High in River Grove, and from Holy Cross Seminary at Notre Dame.

Departmental meetings took place during the morning. The afternoon general session consisted of the featured speaker, followed by open discussion from the floor.

Department heads of the various school faculties presented data on what their respective schools were doing to organize the teaching in English, mathematics, social studies, and the like. Guidance counselors from the four schools met separately for a time to discuss problems.

work is progressing nicely. Most of the ceiling is in, interior painting is under way, and electrical and plumbing fixtures are being installed. Kitchen equipment is being installed also. Other furnishings are ready for delivery as soon as they can be received.

## New Library at Gilmour Academy Named for St. Thomas More

The newest educational facility on the Gilmour Academy campus in 1963 is the Thomas More Library, a building long awaited and now in full use. Among the best equipped prep school

libraries in the United States, it now contains 10,500 volumes and has a total capacity of 30,000 volumes.

The building has two wings, the one for the library including a main read-

ing room, the stack area with mezzanine, a periodicals room, classroom, and a rare-book room.

The administration wing features the language laboratory together with offices for the headmaster and the director of admissions, plus three departmental offices. Aside from the slate-floored foyer, all rooms and hallways in the building are carpeted.

The library itself has a seating capacity of eighty-five. The furniture in this section includes eight carrels, with eight more to be added. The periodicals room contains issues of the forty-five magazines the school subscribes to, along with extensive backfiles of selected publications.

The rare-book room features two collections given as gifts to the Academy. The six hundred volume collection contributed by Dr. Charles Higgins is valued at \$20,000. The Follansbee collection was a gift of Miss Helena McManus. These collections include books from the 17th and 18th centuries, and a number of first editions by Mark Twain, Oliver Goldsmith, Joseph Conrad, and other famous writers.

The language laboratory demonstrates a new concept in the study of a foreign language. The approach is audio-lingual-visual. Tapes and filmstrips are used to convey ideas. Each student uses a headset with combination earphones and microphone.

The teacher console consists of three tape recorders and a turntable, and three auxiliary tape recorders. Ten individual lessons can be broadcast simultaneously. Through intercom, conversations can be held, and broadcasts can be made from student to teacher, student to class, and teacher to student or class. The total cost of the lab was approximately \$9,000.

The planning for the new library at Gilmour took four years. The building was designed by Almirall and Coughlin of Gates Mills, and the contractor was Dunlop and Johnson.

### TWO SCIENCE TEACHERS BRUSH UP WITH NSF

Along with teaching a full schedule of classes at St. Edward High School in Cleveland, Brothers William Schubmehl and John Ryan are attending classes at Western Reserve University.

As qualified physics and science teachers in the Greater Cleveland area, these two teachers have received National Science Foundation grants, covering tuition, books, and a small travel allowance.

Brother John is studying physics especially approved by a national commission of physical science study. Brother William is studying two new topics in his field of chemistry.

Brother John attends classes on Saturday mornings while Brother William studies on Tuesday nights.

### ASPIRANTS COMMENT

"Too many vocations are lost because aspirants to the religious life choose the flight reaction rather than the fight reaction."

### MISSION WORK KEEPS GROWING

The annual report on aid to the foreign missions emanating from the Midwest Province Mission Procurator,

Brother Gonzaga Day, includes the following statistics:

From the thirteen schools and three formation houses of the province, considerable money was contributed by students during the 1962-63 school year for the Community missions.

From his warehouse annexing Columba Hall at Notre Dame, Brother Gonzaga shipped 47,480 pounds of materials to missions in the Southwest and abroad, about half this amount going to houses of Communities other than Holy Cross.

The report indicated that since 1956 a total of 224,413 pounds of clothing and other supplies have been disbursed by the procurator, Brother Gonzaga.

## SCHOOL HAMS IT UP WITH PALS ABROAD

Every Wednesday about 4:30 p.m., St. Edward High School teachers, pupils and alumni can pull up their chairs for a leisurely chat with old friends.

They talk about school banners needed in bright green and white, or the weather, or football scores, or about the sorrow of losing President Kennedy.

That the friends are in Monrovia, Liberia, in West Africa, is just one of the routine marvels of the modern age.

Thanks to Brother Eric Landers, teacher and also moderator of the radio club at the Cleveland school, and Peter Rimmel, a junior at St. Edward, amateur radio contact has been made with two Holy Cross Brothers every week or so since school started this fall.

Brother Eric and Peter are the only two persons at the school licensed to operate a station the quality of K8DTR, in a physics classroom at St. Edward, but many others can and do join in the conversations once the contact has been made.

At the other end of the wireless is Brother Francisco Drury, C.S.C., who went to Africa in October after eleven years of teaching at St. Edward.

Contact between two hams is easy. Brother Francisco is a ham operator himself, so the school group in Cleveland finds it easy to keep in touch with him.

Young Rimmel, who at 16 has made

up his mind to be an electrical engineer, keeps a log of all contacts and supervises them in his capacity as second in command to Brother Eric at K8DTR.

Peter's own station, K8UNP (for "undernourished Pete," he says) is undergoing reconstruction just north of St. Edward at the Rimmel home. The boy cannot reach Brothers Francisco and Chester (another former teacher at St. Edward, and who preceded Brother Francisco to the Monrovia school) on his own station, he says wistfully, without an antenna approaching the 75-foot aerial reaching above the St. Edward High building.

The teachers in Monrovia tell of what they need for the mission, such as bulbs for a film projector, drums for the band, banners in the green and white colors of St. Patrick's. They are told what has been sent and what is still being sought.

They chat about the weather, often a subject of some contrast.

Visitors joining the Wednesday sessions, the only standing date of the St. Edward Radio Club, have included a Brother from Akron's Hoban High School who came up to learn whether he could tune in to the talks. He was told he could and given the frequency, 14.340 megacycles.

## BROTHER GODFREY RECEIVES HONORARY DOCTORATE FROM PORTLAND UNIVERSITY

At the dinner celebrating his golden jubilee in the Congregation of Holy Cross, Brother Godfrey Vassallo was awarded an honorary doctorate in science by the University of Portland, Oregon.

"He has captured the essence of what education is about—the teaching of a student," Father Paul E. Waldschmidt, C.S.C., president of the university, told the nearly 400 people who gathered at the university on December 1st to honor Brother Godfrey.

Applause greeted Father Waldschmidt's announcement that the gathering was an academic convocation and that Brother Godfrey was to receive there the university's highest honor, an honorary doctor of science degree.

Very Rev. Howard J. Kenna, C.S.C., president of the university for seven years before he was appointed Provincial of the Indiana province of the Congregation of Holy Cross, was one of many visitors present. The mayor of Portland, an alumnus of the university, attended also and presented the jubilarian with a key to the city. Such keys, the mayor said, went to many distinguished visitors, but all should "thank God we have in our midst such a man as Brother Godfrey."

The Nova Scotia-born physicist also received a plaque from the school's alumni association, a gift from the parents' club, and a scroll from fellow members of the faculty.

Brother Godfrey has been head of the University of Portland's department of physics since 1929. His teaching career in Holy Cross schools began forty-seven years ago.
