

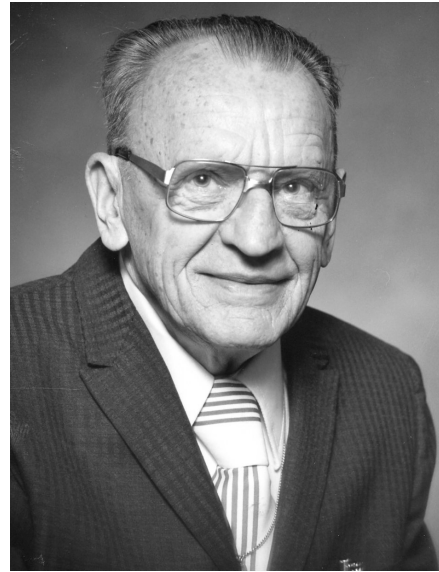

Brother Regis (Robert) Regensburger, C.S.C.

born: 19 December 1899

died: 30 September 1987



Regis was born in McKeesport, Pennsylvania where he attended school. After school he worked as a draftsman and layout manager at the U.S. Steel Corporation for 15 years. In 1932, he joined Holy Cross at the juniorate at Watertown. He made his first vows in 1935 and began studies at Notre Dame. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1939, and a master's degree in science in 1948. His first teaching assignment was at Vincentian Institute. He taught at Cathedral High, where he was principal for 6 years and then taught at Reitz Memorial in Evansville. In 1961, he took on the position as assistant to the novice master for 7 years, a full-time job in the days when there were 60 or more novices. In 1968, Regis studied library science at Indiana University so that he could be of service as librarian at LeMans Academy. In 1973, Regis retired to the Holy Cross Brothers Center serving at the telephone switchboard every morning. He enjoyed rounds of golf and ice skating when the weather was appropriate. Regis was flexible at the time of Vatican II. He was not one who was afraid of new ideas and new styles. He had many friends at Notre Dame, among them golfers and professors.
