

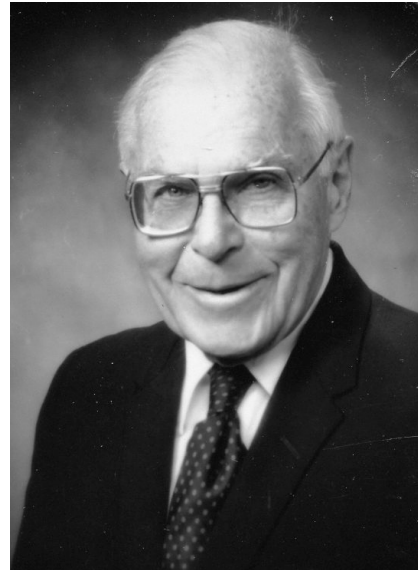

Brother Robert (Cyprian) Milke, C.S.C.

died: 17 December 1991



Robert/Cyprian was born in Muskegon, Michigan and attended schools there. He went to Muskegon Junior College and worked as a stock clerk. He joined Holy Cross in 1935 went to the juniorate in Watertown and novitiate where he pronounced his first vows in 1937. He studied at Notre Dame, earned his A.B. degree in 1939. His teaching career began at Watertown, then New Orleans, Long Beach, Albany, Indianapolis, Holy Trinity, South Bend Central Catholic, and Monroe (where he was superior and principal for 3 years). In 1956, he studied at St. John's University and earned a degree in library science. He taught for 3 years at Indianapolis and then returned to Holy Trinity in Chicago for 15 years, primarily as the librarian. In 1975 he went to California to teach at Sherman Oaks and Long Beach. In 1984 he worked at the Inter-Faith Clearing House in Casper, Wyoming. In 1987 he served as a counselor with Youth Services in South Bend. In 1991 he moved to Dujarie House after a full and varied life of service for his community.
