Brother Remigius (Hubert) Bullinger, C.S.C.

born: 3 November 1913

died: 5 March 2002



Remigius was born in Jackson, Michigan, attended schools there. He studied at Sacred Heart College in Watertown. After completing his novitiate year in 1932, he studied at Notre Dame and earned his degree in 1936. His first assignment was to teach at Fort Wayne. In 1938 he taught at Holy Cross in New Orleans for 5 years. He did graduate studies in English at the University of Wisconsin. In 1944, he became assistant principal of Catholic Central High in Monroe for 7 years. He taught at Notre Dame High in Sherman Oaks, and then was assistant principal for 4 years in Indianapolis. In 1958 he returned to Monroe as principal for 3 years. In 1961 Remigius was named headmaster of Sacred Heart Military Academy for 6 years and then was assistant headmaster of Gilmour Academy for 5 years. He was principal of an elementary school in Merrillville, Indiana and joined the faculty of Richard High in Riverview, Michigan. In 1984 he worked with the pastoral team at St. Aloysius Parish in Detroit. In 1991 he retired to Casa Santa Cruz in Phoenix until poor health brought him to Notre Dame in 2000. Remigius was a witty and gifted teacher of English. His poetic skills were legendary with the many encomiums composed on the lives of deceased confreres, feasts of the community, and the liturgical year. They were much appreciated as was his incomparable, unflinching and impish sense of humor.
