

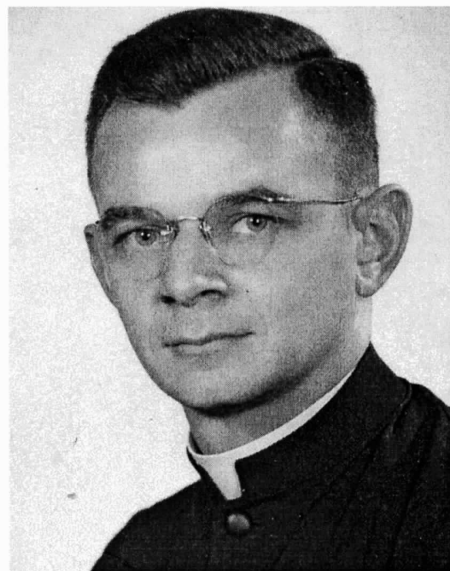

Charles was born in Akron and attended schools there. He joined the Brothers at Watertown in 1947. After graduating from Notre Dame in 1952, he served for a short time at Gibault School before being assigned to the foreign missions in East Pakistan. He spent a total of 14 years teaching in high schools and trade schools in Bandura and Dacca. He returned to the U.S. in 1966 to teach at St. Edward High in Lakewood for 7 years. In 1973 he began his ministry at Boysville of Michigan, where he devoted 27 years of his life. Charles had a keen sensitivity to the needs and feelings of others. This enabled him to become a fraternal and paternal advisor and confidant to the hundreds of students he taught, especially the young men in difficulty whom he served at Boysville. Charles found time to enjoy a hobby of producing trophy awards. He turned it into a full-time job, and furnished hundreds of various trophies for the Knights of Columbus and other organizations. His headquarters became known as "Awardsville". His perpetual good humor and tendency towards puns endeared him to all. Many student lives were enriched by his professional and personal concern.
