

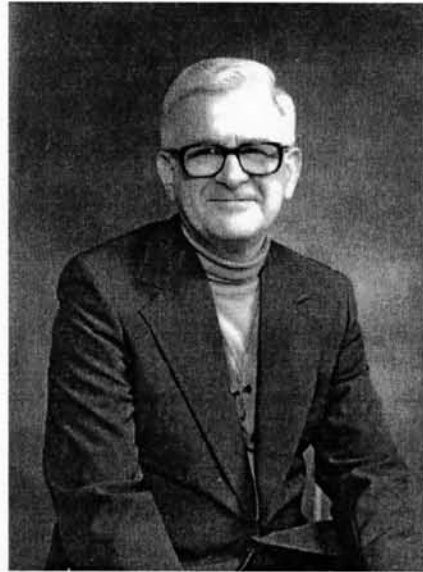

Brother Barry (Robert) Lambour, C.S.C.

born: 31 March 1917

died: 30 June 2006



Barry was born in Altoona, Pennsylvania and attended schools there. He worked in refrigerator maintenance for a period and in 1940, he joined Holy Cross at Watertown. After his novitiate he studied at Notre Dame and graduated with a Degree in Electrical Engineering. He went on to earn a masters degree in the same field at the University of Texas. He joined the faculty of St. Edward's University in 1945 and taught for 10 years. In 1955, he was named principal of St. Edward High School in Lakewood serving for 6 years. He then became principal at Holy Trinity High School in Chicago for 3 years. In 1965, he began several years of service for the Cleveland archdiocese. He was superintendent of the Summit County Catholic schools in Akron for 8 years until 1975. He continued his leadership role and was principal of Our Lady of the Elms High School in Akron for 3 years, then spent 5 years as principal of Peninsula Catholic High in Newport News, Virginia. He returned to Ohio in 1984 to join the faculty of Gilmour Academy for 4 years. Barry retired from teaching in 1988 and returned to Akron to be moderator of the Associates of St. Joseph. He assisted in RCIA programs while living at Hoban. Barry was one of the community's most talented and devoted educators. He applied his engineering skills of precision and perseverance and left every assignment more richly endowed with his talents than when he arrived.
