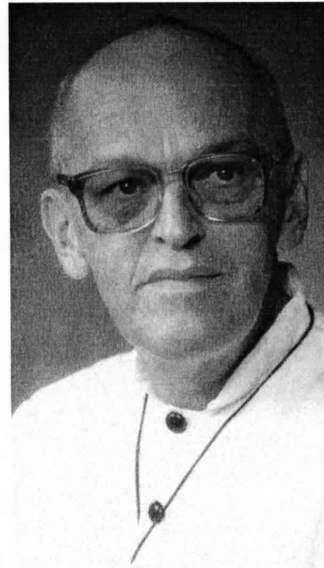

Brother Frederick James McGlynn, C.S.C.

Frederick was born in Detroit and graduated from St. Mary of Redford High in 1945. He studied at the University of Detroit and then Wayne State for two years. An ad in *Our Sunday Visitor* influenced him to join Holy Cross. He went to the juniorate in 1949 and made first vows in 1950. He finished his studies at Notre Dame graduating *cum laude* with a B.S. degree in 1952. He taught for 13 years at Boysville and Catholic Central in Monroe, MI and Gilmour Academy. In 1965 he was assigned to teach in Ghana where he spent the next 33 years. He was a master teacher of mathematics earning a great reputation such that students came from around the country to have Fred as their college math teacher. He was an excellent administrator who served as Headmaster at St. John's for 6 years and was District Superior or Assistant for 13 ears. Fred was a meticulous and proficient organizer, noted for precision and ability to solve problems. When he completed his terms as Headmaster and District Superior, he returned to teaching. Such was not the usual case. In Ghana, "*once a chief, always a chief,*" means that a leader just doesn't return to ordinary jobs. But Fred loved teaching and his students. He was an excellent example for our young Ghanaian Brothers. He returned to the U.S. in 1998 to reside at Columba Hall and Schubert Villa where his computer skills were used to teach others, organize house meetings, produce newsletters, and especially carry on a faithful correspondence with dear friends in Ghana.
