In a letter to Brother Ivan Dolan, who is on leave from many years of service in East Pakistan, Brother John Rozario said that the matriculation examination results at Holy Cross High School, Bandura, were very good again this year. Of the forty-one students in the senior class, all qualified for the government examination, and all passed it: two in the first division, thirty-two in second, six in third.

Brother Robert Siegel, principal of St. Edward High School, Lakewood, took part with other teachers, supervisors and administrators in a workshop on "Getting the Most Out of Educational Innovations," sponsored by the NCEA and the National Association of Secondary School Principals. The workshop was held at Marquette University from July 23 to 26 and at Georgetown University from August 6 to 9. Brother Robert was discussion leader for a paper, "How Do You Know Whether Innovative Programs Are Better Than What They Replace," given by Dr. Paul B. Diederich, of the Educational Testing Service, Princeton.

Brother John Driscoll, president of Holy Cross Junior College, delivered the commencement address on July 26th at graduation ceremonies at Ancilla College, Donaldson, Indiana.

On July 28th the annual Departure Ceremony for Brothers newly appointed to or returning to overseas' assignments took place in the chapel of Holy Cross Junior College. Principal celebrant was Rev. Leonard C. Gross, of Grand Rapids, Michigan; concelebrants were Holy Cross Fathers Robert M. Hoffman, Louis J. Putz, Richard A. Papen, and Thomas E. Chambers. Father Hoffman gave the sermon. Missionaries taking part in the ceremony were Brothers Eduardo Michalik and Richard Gilman (Cape Coast, Ghana), Lawrence Stewart and Vincent Gross (Sekondi, Ghana), and Jerome Aschenbrenner (Monrovia, Liberia).

Final profession ceremonies will be held in the chapel of Holy Cross Junior College on August 16 at ten o'clock in the morning.
