Brother Donatus Schmitz, Provincial, returned to his office on January 6, 1968 following a visit to Liberia, Ghana, and Rome. While in Africa he interviewed Brothers assigned there, and held many dialogue sessions with groups of them. In Rome he met with the Very Rev. Superior General and with members of the General Administration.

On returning to the office Brother Donatus wrote a letter to parents of all the Brothers in West Africa in which he said in part: "It is true that the Brothers in West Africa continue to make sacrifices, for the economy is poor. Nevertheless, I have never seen the spirit of sacrifice practiced so generously and happily, with such peace of heart. All are busy, as usual."

When feasible, the Provincial should erect a District of West Africa, to include Liberia and Ghana." This is a recommendation of the Provincial Chapter of 1967. At the time of his recent visit to Liberia, Ghana, and Rome, Brother Donatus Schmitz, Provincial, officially set up the District of West Africa. However, many details governing the district will be determined after recommendations are made by the Brothers.

Area Committees should be formed for the organization of province workshops and meetings as outlined." Brother Donatus Schmitz, Provincial, has assigned Area #3 committee to organize the Superior's Workshop agenda for Jan. 20, 1968. This workshop will be held at the Provincial Office. (See Circular Letter of the Provincial dated Sept. 30, 1967, pp. 16 and 17.)

St. Edward High School, Lakewood, will be included in an education film which will be premiered at the NCEA Convention this spring in San Francisco. Ninety Catholic secondary schools are included in the film; these schools were chosen from among the nation's schools as being among the most innovative and forward. The team teaching program at St. Edward is being spotlighted. Present at St. Edward during the filming and included in the scenes were Brother C. Albert Koob, NCEA executive secretary, and Dr. Melvin Heller, Loyola University.
