Brother Benjamin McNulty, 84, of Columba Hall, died at 5:15 p.m. Sunday, March 28th, in St. Joseph Hospital, South Bend. This coming July he was to celebrate his golden jubilee of religious profession. For 38 years he served most conscientiously as a canvasser for the Ave Maria magazine. All his religious life he has been an admirable example to his fellow religious.

This letter from Father Hesburgh, president of Notre Dame, written to Br. Charles Krupp shortly after Benjamin's death, sums up our own fond recollections of Benjamin and expresses our sense of loss. "I just learned this morning before offering Mass that Brother Benjamin had died over the weekend. He was a great old fellow whom I admired very much. My best remembrance of him is sitting back in the corner of the basement chapel quietly praying and always ready to serve Mass for those of us who arrived at odd hours. He was doing this for so many years that it almost seemed like he was part of the place. When I heard of his death this morning, I offered Mass for the repose of his good soul and thought long thoughts about his great fidelity over so many years. I regret that I have to go to Washington on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week to launch the 1976 AGENDA of the Overseas Development Council of which I am chairman. Otherwise, I would be at his funeral on Wednesday. However, I will offer Mass for him again on Wednesday in Washington. My sympathy to Brother's family and to the Brothers for losing a fine religious."

FROM KATHMANDU IN NEPAL: Br. John Harris has contracted to stay on for another year at the Jesuits' St. Xavier High School. In a recent letter John wrote: "...Our annual leave was during January and I spent it mainly in Calcutta. Twelve of our scouts and Fr. Chambers from Nepal spent two weeks working at the various clinics staffed by the Missionary Brothers of Charity and operated by the famous Mother Teresa of Calcutta. I likewise got involved with the scouts to give them encouragement and moral support... In another three months Holy Cross members should be popping in for their annual vacation here in Kathmandu (CSC men in Bangladesh). Brs. HOLY CROSS APPRECIATION DAYS - SOUTH BEND, INDIANA: As part of St. Joseph County's bi-centennial celebration, March 19, 20, and 21 were designated "Holy Cross Appreciation Days." A committee of lay people in the South Bend area, chaired by Chuck Lennon, planned the three-day celebration to commemorate the 135 years of service to the area by Holy Cross priests, brothers, and sisters.

Highlighting the events were: a talent review and fashion show in the Morris Civic Auditorium; the Presbyterian Players' production of "You Can't Take It with You" in the O'Laughlin Auditorium; a dinner in St. Mary's College dining hall; and various activities in local parishes.

The South Bend Tribune ran a four-page article in its Sunday magazine edition, and WNDU-TV showed a half-hour program commemorating the event and in which Br. Donatus was a member of the panel.

Bumper stickers were printed up for the occasion. Each provincial was given an impressive booklet containing letters and telegrams from President Ford, Governor Bowen, bishops, congressmen, mayors, and other civic and religious groups of the area.

STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING, MARCH 13TH, at Monroe: First item for discussion was the two sessions of Midwest Focus and how the spirit engendered at the Focus could be sustained throughout the province. Br. Barry reported that all sessions of Focus had been taped, and that the complete series of Fr. Gorman's talks could be procured for \$12 through Br. John Miller at Louisville. \*\*\* Next item under discussion was the possibility of having two "information days" at the beginning of the chapter in June, with prepared talks by religious or lay people, capitulants or non-capitulants, on major province concerns. The purpose would be to educate members of the province and to enrich backgrounds of the capitulants for committee work. The chapter committees would determine what topics should be covered and who would deliver the presentation. Committees are being asked to give this consideration at their April meetings. \*\*\* It was decided that the chapter will begin on the morning of June 13th.

FROM DACCA DISTRICT: In early March, Fr. Barrosse visited the Holy Cross communities in the district. \*\*\* The aspirants at Nagari have been teaching two mentally handicapped young men preparing for their First Communion. \*\*\* St. Nicholas High School, in Nagari, was visited by Halloween-type jokers one night. Opposition party members painted anti-government slogans on the school with tar. Nearby schools received the same treatment. \*\*\* At St. Joseph School of Industrial Trades, roofing of the fitting shop is now complete and the floor is ready for pouring. March 26th was the date set for shifting the machine shop equipment to temporary quarters so that the old quarters can be removed. \*\*\* St. St. Joseph High School, Mohammedpur, as part of the "Martyrs' Day" observance, Br. Thomas gave about 200 students one taka each to be used for the poor. This was intended to raise the students' consciousness regarding the poor.
