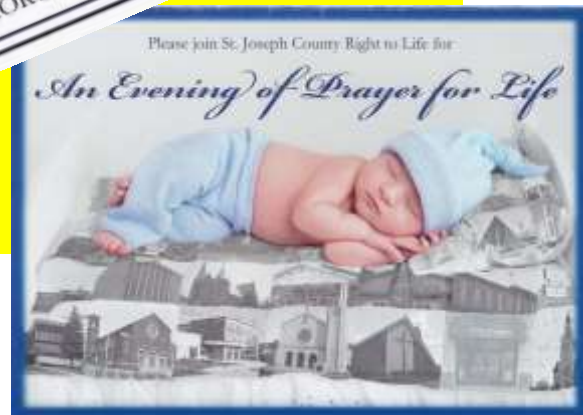

“The Gift of Self: A Lenten Practice”

Jaclyn Champagne Terranova studied psychology and deaf studies at College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, MA. After her undergraduate studies, Jaclyn completed a year of service with the Jesuit Volunteer Corp in San Diego and later served as a professional advocate for women and children in situations of domestic violence through the Children's Hospital of Boston. She earned a master's degree in Pastoral Ministry at Boston College. After graduate school, Jaclyn completed her professional training in hospital chaplaincy through the Clinical Pastoral Education program (CPE) at Hartford Hospital, Hartford, CT. She shifted her focus to hospice chaplaincy and served as the Spiritual Care Coordinator for Acera Care Hospice until she moved to South Bend. After arriving in South Bend, she accepted a position as a Research Assistant and Program Coordinator in the Hildebrand Center for Compassionate Care at Notre Dame. She is now the Director of Pastoral Care at Sanctuary Holy Cross Long Term Care and Rehabilitation Center in South Bend.

"As disciples of Jesus we stand side by side with all people." This call to the work of the Gospel, found in the Holy Cross Constitutions, is ever before us as a challenge to live out our mission as a Holy Cross school. Since 2008, our community has stood together with the students of Basil Moreau School in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Each year, the proceeds raised in our annual "Eagles on Foot" 5k race and 1 mile walk are donated to



support the work of Holy Cross in Haiti. Founded by the Congregation of Holy Cross in 1989, Basil Moreau School serves over 1,000 low-income children in the neighborhood of Carrefour in Port-au-Prince. Heavily damaged (including the complete loss of the secondary school) in the January 2010 earthquake that ravaged Haiti, the school has been completely rebuilt and restored, and remains steadfast in its mission to provide quality education and hope to the people of Port-au-Prince.

This partnership has provided countless opportunities for our students to learn more about the work of Holy Cross outside of the United States, to explore the realities of income inequality, educational disparity, and the challenges of providing high quality education to all of God's children. Each spring our freshman learn about the work of Basil Moreau School in their theology classes, including some first-hand accounts from theology teacher Patrick Chrosniak '02, who has visited the school in Haiti. We have also had the opportunity to host Rev. Rosemond Marcelin, C.S.C., principal of Basil Moreau School, who spoke to students as well as faculty, staff, and administrators during his visit to St. Ed's. Eagles on Foot also serves as a hands (and feet!) on service learning experience for a number of our students. Each year, Director of Service and Outreach Rick Kubrak '07 works with a dedicated team of student volunteers to promote the event, register runners, as well as facilitate the race day. Eagles on Foot provides an opportunity for students to give of their time and talents in service of a cause larger than themselves.

By creating an opportunity for our school to stand in solidarity with the community of Basil Moreau School, providing a vehicle for our students to learn more about the work of Holy Cross around the globe, and to join in their efforts to provide education to those in great need, Eagles on Foot is this week's Lesson of the Week.

We invite all of you to join us this year in our partnership with the faculty, staff, and students of Basil Moreau School by registering to run or walk in this year's Eagles on Foot on Saturday, April 8, at 9:30 am. Online registration closes next Friday, and all proceeds from the race will go directly to the work of Holy Cross in Haiti. If you are unable to participate in the walk or run, come on out to cheer on the participants and celebrate with food and drink at the post-race reception.
