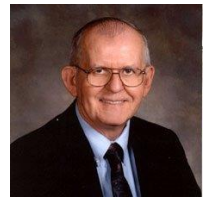

This Amazing Community Facility

Supporting Sarasota's Seniors PAUL CARAGIULO

As you make the gentle turn to the west on Mound Street near the junction of 301 and US 41, many recognize the beautiful campus that sits between 301 and Osprey Avenue. Some are even aware that this is the Main Campus for Friendship Centers. However, I believe relatively few members of our community are aware of what goes on at this amazing community facility that is adjacent to a beautiful and somewhat under-utilized city park.



Friendship Centers was founded as Senior Friendship Centers in 1973 by **Brother William Geenen**, a member of the Congregation of Holy Cross. Brother Geenen's goal was quite simple: to help older adults in Southwest Florida live with dignity and independence. Since that time, Friendship Centers has been a leader in developing innovative and cost effective services for our older population. The organization's model focuses on volunteerism, or as we like to say, "People Helping People." It is a great organization and I am very proud to serve on the Board of Governors.

What began in a small bungalow in downtown Sarasota now spans five counties and has grown into a national model for providing services to our older population. Adult day services provide a safe and caring place for older adults with memory and cognitive impairments, allowing their caregivers to work, run errands, attend a support group at the center, or take a much needed break. The Activity Centers in Sarasota and Venice help prevent social isolation by providing light-filled spaces to take classes, exercise, play cards, socialize, create art, dance and make friends. And the healthcare clinics provide medical and dental care for low-income adults aged 50-plus at clinics staffed by volunteer physicians, dentists, pharmacists, nurses and other health professionals.

If it weren't for our clinics, older adults in our community might not seek treatment,

because they cannot afford it. They would postpone dental care, enabling tooth loss and infections. They may let vision problems, diabetes maintenance or hypertension remain untreated. They might ignore a respiratory infection, allowing for pneumonia and other problems.

For these reasons and more, Friendship Centers is in dire need of support. Although we have volunteers providing medical and dental care, we need to pay clinic support staff and nurses. We need to keep the lights on and the AC running. We need to maintain our building structures.

Today, it costs more than \$1,000 per day just to keep each Activity Center open. And while costs rise, community support and state/government funding continue to decline. Friendship Centers is currently seeking assistance from the state to make these spaces safer for older adults, through facility improvements and additions, but more help is needed. As a private nonprofit, Friendship Centers relies heavily on support from the community.

This is why we need you.

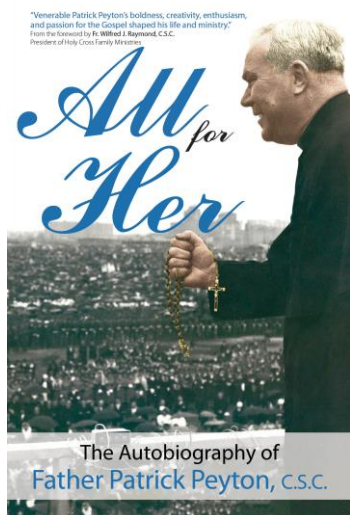

NEW EDITION OF PEYTON AUTOBIOGRAPHY INCLUDES HIS CAUSE FOR SAINTHOOD

NOTRE DAME, Ind.—Ave Maria Press is releasing a new edition of the autobiography of Father Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., who was given the title of “venerable” by Pope Francis in December 2017, taking the “Rosary Priest” another step closer to sainthood.

All for Her tells the story of Peyton’s life and dedication to the Blessed Mother as he discerned his vocation, overcame the obstacles of advanced tuberculosis and lack of education, and became a priest who eventually preached to more than 28 million people worldwide, worked with Hollywood stars, and founded Family Rosary and Family Theater Productions.

Originally published in 1967 and reissued in a revised edition in 1997, the third edition of *All for Her* includes black-and-white photos and a new foreword by Holy Cross Family Ministries President Rev. Willy Raymond, C.S.C., reflecting on Peyton’s legacy as a saint for family prayer and his cause for canonization.

Peyton—the Irish-born priest best known for the inspirational phrases “the family that prays together stays together” and “a world at prayer is a world at peace”—encouraged family prayer and devotion to the rosary, something he learned in his own family, throughout his ministry.

When Peyton was diagnosed with advanced tuberculosis, he prayed to the Virgin Mary and his health quickly began to improve. In gratitude he committed his vocation to promote devotion to the Blessed Mother and the Rosary.

Peyton embraced the new media as a means to reach people across the globe, and developed radio and television programs that spread a message of prayer and family unity. He founded Family Theater Productions in 1947. Performers in his productions included stars of Hollywood’s golden age, such as Bing Crosby, Grace Kelly, Gregory Peck, and Lucille Ball.

Peyton also preached to millions in person, organizing 260 Rosary Crusades across the globe. Peyton continued to be active until the 1990s and died in 1992. In 1997, the cause for his canonization was opened.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Father Patrick Peyton, C.S.C. (1909–92), “The Rosary Priest,” was an Irish-born priest of the Congregation of Holy Cross who founded Family Rosary and Family Theater Productions, both of which continue today as part of Holy Cross Family Ministries. Peyton was declared venerable by Pope Francis in 2017.

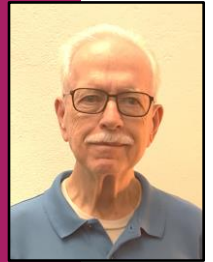
