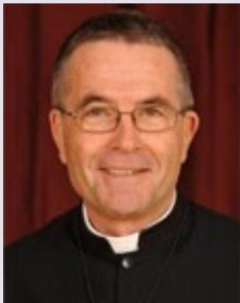

Shroud of Turin Talk by Brother Lawrence Stewart

On Tuesday, Feb 17th, “Ash Wednesday eve,” Larry Stewart gave a 45-minute presentation with photos in the Columba Hall Chapel entitled, “*Science and the Shroud.*” It was a PowerPoint show complete with appropriate slides of research work on the Shroud of Turin done by Prof.

Steve Mattingly.



Steve is from Evansville, a 1961 graduate of Reitz Memorial High. Steve was convinced by the Brothers at Memorial to go to college down at St. Edward’s University in Austin. Steve studied biology and was Br. Daniel Lynch’s lab assistant for 2 years. He wanted to major in microbiology, so he had to transfer to the University of Texas where he graduated in 1965.

Steve went to graduate school at Temple University where he earned his PhD with honors. He was hired at the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio where he was a research lecturer and professor in the Department of Microbiology teaching in the Medical and Dental Schools for 33 years.

Larry said that he has known Steve for more than 20 years. While teaching in New Orleans at Our Lady of Holy Cross College, he applied for a research-study grant with the American Society for Microbiology and spent two summers working with professors at the UT Health Science Center in San Antonio. That’s where he and Steve Mattingly became good friends.

Steve’s primary research work was in studying bacteria and learning practical applications of their use in nature. For instance, he developed cultures of bacteria that could digest grease and oil build-up in kitchen drains.

Steve’s more fascinating research was in analyzing some fibers from the Shroud of Turin that he received in 1993. He wondered whether the “resident” bacteria that normally are found on everybody’s skin could have been responsible for the formation of the image on the Shroud. Steve had learned, “when analyzing a

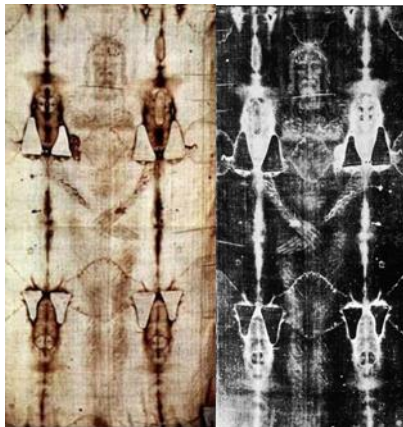
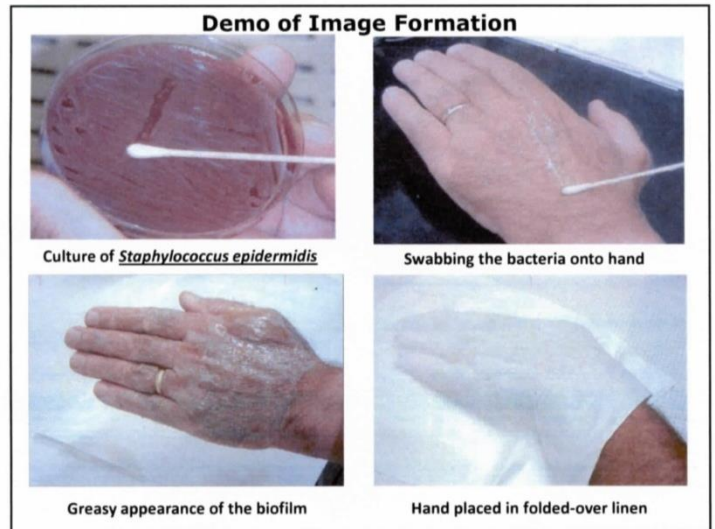
problem in science, you first start with the simplest explanation.” The image on the Shroud has been attributed to special unknown artwork, or some kind of radiation or lasers or supernatural light.



Steve performed a simple experiment by using ordinary skin bacteria (*Staphylococcus Epidermidis*). He coated the back of his hand with the bacteria, then inserted his hand into a fold of ordinary linen. He stayed motionless for 30 minutes, then peeled the linen off his hand and noticed a straw-yellow outline of his fingers and hand from the drying of the bacteria. A photo of that hand showed a darkish image of his hand, exactly like photos of the Man of the Shroud. Steve has reported his work at numerous scientific meetings, in microbiology research papers, and presentations to the public.

He is writing a book now entitled, “How Skin Bacteria Produced the Image on the Shroud of Turin.”

As Steve has said, “This demonstration and hypothesis is the ONLY natural explanation of how the image on the Shroud would be formed from what Jesus suffered in the scourging, from the crown of thorns, the crucifixion, his death, and eventual wrapping of His body in the burial linen.”

Health Updates

Here is an update on the status of some of our members who have recently experienced some health difficulties:

- 1) **Brother Henry Skitzki** was briefly discharged from South Bend Memorial Hospital on Wednesday, Feb. 18th, but has since been readmitted. The suspicion is that an old infusion port is causing an infection. Henry was scheduled to have the port removed, and to start a course of antibiotics. Once discharged, Henry will begin a period of physical rehabilitation at Dujarie House.
- 2) **Brother John Doran** (Moreau Province) is now back at Columba Hall after a bout of pneumonia and reports feeling much improved.
- 3) **Brother John May** has returned to Schubert Villa having recovered sufficiently from flu-like symptoms. Prior to going to the hospital, it appears John fell and broke three ribs.
- 4) **Brother Charles McBride** was afraid he suffered a “set back” on Sunday evening and spent a few days at Memorial Hospital, but is now back at Dujarie House for continued rehabilitation. The valve repair/replacement is working just fine, and the thought is that Charlie contracted a “virus” which caused a high temperature, cold shivers, and elevated blood pressure.
